






#### Who do we serve?

The Fund covers costs associated with the application process and initial training needs which reduces financial barriers to union construction apprenticeships.

More than 95% of the 149 candidates served in 2019 by the Fund are women and people of color



## What is the impact that you make?

The Fund has helped cover costs that might have kept eligible candidates from starting a new career as a union apprentice. With the support of committed donors, we're able to continue to Increase diversity in a wide range of construction trades, while also making an impact in the lives of Individuals and families through access to living-wage jobs.

## What are the challenges they face?

While getting on the path to a career in the construction trades is difficult for any underrepresented group, there are certain populations that face specific challenges that decrease their likelihood of successfully completing the process.

Women and ex-offenders are two groups with unique needs that the Fund helps to address through specialized support.

## What are the barriers to a career in the trades?

Unlike many job changes, **beginning a career in the trades comes with numerous upfront costs.** From application fees and clothing, to test prep resources, tools and transportation, becoming a construction apprentice can be an expensive endeavor. The Fund helps to **remove these barriers for eligible candidates, increasing their chances of success.**


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## HIRE360's Pre-Test

- 5 Sections:
  - Reading Comprehension
  - 10<sup>th</sup> Grade math
    - Adding, subtracting multiplying and dividing fractions and decimals
  - Numerical reasoning
    - Number patterns
  - Basic mechanical physics
    - Levers, pulleys, gears
  - Visual-Spatial reasoning or "Paper Folding"







# **Program Overview**

- Tutors will train candidates in mathematics and reading comprehension in areas including, but not limited to, basic mathematical operations, reading comprehension, spatial visualization, numerical reasoning and computation, and mechanical reasoning.





# **Obligations and Compensation**

- 1. Complete application and follow up interview
- 2. Tutor candidates 5 hours per month or as needed
- 3. Dependable online access for remote instruction
- 4. Respond to program related emails within 24 hours
- 5. \$50 per hour pay rate
- 6. Opportunity to expand and grow within program
